Fall 2024 Graduation

The University of Arkansas celebrated over 2,000 graduates from the 2024 summer and fall semesters during two Winter Commencement Ceremonies last month. Chancellor Charles Robinson addressed graduates from the Bumpers College of Agriculture and the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences, in the first ceremony. In the second ceremony, J. Bryan Hunt, Jr., delivered keynote remarks highlighting the strong connection between J.B. Hunt and the



university, noting that every president, CEO, and chairperson in the company's history has been a University of Arkansas graduate.

Lt. Gen. Jay B. Silveria Chosen as Next UA System President

The University of Arkansas Board of Trustees unanimously approved the

selection of retired U.S. Air Force Lt. Gen. Jay B. Silveria as the next president of the University of Arkansas system. Silveria brings a wealth of leadership experience, recently serving as associate vice president and executive director of Texas A&M University and the Bush School of Government & Public Service in Washington, D.C. His distinguished career also includes serving as superintendent of the U.S. Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs, Colorado—a testament to his commitment to excellence in education and leadership development.



U of A Announces \$122 Million in Gifts Toward Land of Opportunity Scholarship Campaign

The University of Arkansas has launched a \$200 million fundraising initiative to support its new Land of Opportunity Scholarship campaign. This ambitious effort includes a cornerstone planned gift of \$100 million from Jane Hunt and Bryan Hunt, made on behalf of the J.B. and Johnelle Hunt family.

The three year campaign will establish an endowment addressing funding gaps for academically accomplished Arkansans with significant financial need, including those eligible for Pell Grants. This initiative aligns with the university's commitment to accessibility and opportunity, also reflected in last fall's recordbreaking enrollment of Arkansas students. Planned Gift Benefits Bumper College

Larry and Brenda Sandage, of Donaldson, Arkansas, made a planned gift to Bumpers College and the University of Arkansas, creating a \$150,000 endowed



scholarship for undergraduate students in crop, soil, and environmental sciences. Larry earned bachelor's and master's degrees in agronomy from the U of A and dedicated 28 years to extension work before transitioning to leadership roles in healthcare. Brenda, a retired business coordinator, also worked in healthcare and community development. The Sandage's gift reflects their desire to help

Beneficiary Designation

Good news if you've considered supporting the University of Arkansas with a gift but don't currently have liquid assets to give! You can make an impact through a beneficiary designation and ensure your assets are distributed according to your wishes at your death, and without them being included in the probate process.

Beneficiary designations let you decide who will receive specific assets during your lifetime. People commonly use beneficiary designations for retirement accounts (like 401(k) plans, IRAs, and pension plans) and life insurance policies. Account holders often use payable or transfer on death designations for bank and investment accounts and now even real property may be transferred at death with beneficiary deeds. All of these may be changed or revoked by you during your lifetime.

Several benefits of giving these kinds of assets include simplified planning, ease of supporting causes you care about (like the U of A!), continued use of your accounts during your lifetime, and potential estate tax and probate cost savings for heirs.

To make such a gift, simply complete a beneficiary designation form with your plan custodian, banker, broker, or attorney, naming the University of Arkansas Foundation as a beneficiary of all or part of the value of the asset. Be sure to let us know of your plan—we can ensure your gift impacts the area of campus you are passionate about!
